

Light Pollution's Negative Impact

WHAT: Hidden in Plain Sight: How Artificial Light at Night Impacts the

Environment and Human Health WHEN: Monday, April 10 @7:00 p.m. WHERE: Glenview Public Library

We are living in an environment with excessive use of artificial outdoor light. You may not notice its ever-increasing levels because you have grown accustomed to it. Unless you're a stargazer, you may not even be aware of it. But scientists are increasingly raising awareness of the harmful impacts of this non-traditional "pollutant."

Greener Glenview is sponsoring the April 10 program to inform residents about those impacts and identify actions they can take to reduce the environmental and health impacts of outdoor & indoor artificial light at night (ALAN). This program also has applicability to local government decision-making.

Village commissions evaluate lighting during their review of new and expanded business developments, in accordance with design guidelines and ordinances. Currently, there is no requirement to consider the wide-ranging effects of ALAN on the environment and human health as part of that evaluation. We hope that the information presented in this program will factor into their future decision-making related to night-time lighting.

As an example, on Monday evening April 3rd, the Development Adjustment Commission will consider one of these developments: the Valley Lo Club proposal to construct pickle ball courts, a parking lot, and new lighting along the West Fork of the North Branch of the Chicago River. It is expected that several speakers will address the implications of artificial light at night at that location. Read more about this proposal.

Video of the Month: Pesky Plants -- Lesser celandine

Watch for this invasive coming up right now

Be on the lookout for this pretty but very invasive plant coming up right now. It's

called Lesser celandine. Native to Europe, Asia, and northern Africa, Lesser celandine was likely introduced to the U.S. as an ornamental plant in the 19th century. It has become a very invasive plan—partly because it is still sold as fig buttercup. Do not add it to your landscape. Watch this video to learn about lesser celandine and how to get rid of it. Hint, you'll have to be persistent.
