Are All Trees Equal?

The Environment and Natural Resources Commission is close to completing the update of Glenview's Tree Preservation Ordinance. As we've reported in earlier bulletins, Planning Division Manager Tony Repp and Community Development Director Jeff Brady have focused the discussion on the main goal of the Tree Preservation Ordinance:

- to preserve healthy trees by keeping them in the ground where possible
- to incentivize planting of as many replacement trees as possible

The discussion of fee structure is nearly complete. At the next meeting, staff will bring back "real world" examples of past tree permit negotiations, to show how the new fee structure will help achieve the ordinance goal.

The second topic on the agenda will be the tree species list. Are some trees more valuable than others? Should the ordinance incentivize so-called high-value trees? Native trees? Biodiversity in our tree canopy? When the commission completes its work, the draft update of the Tree Preservation Ordinance will be sent to the village board of trustees for adoption.

Plan to attend the next ENRC meeting Monday, July 29. Check the Village of Glenview <u>website</u> to confirm the date and agenda.



Tales from the Front: Wasps

One of our Glenview Native Habitat Neighborhood Ambassadors recently spotted a gray, papery nest growing on the gutter near the doorway to her back yard. A google image search identified it as a baldfaced hornet nest. Because her garden is certified as wildlife-friendly through the National Wildlife Federation, she wanted to avoid using a pesticide to get rid of the nest. So, she looked into alternative solutions.

How do you get rid of a baldfaced hornet nest? According to the University of Illinois Extension, the answer to this question is, "Do you need to?" If someone in the household is allergic, then removing the nest would be called for, and they recommend calling in a professional. But these wasps are beneficial insects, consuming other pests including fighting with the groundnesting yellowjackets. Also, baldfaced hornets are not out to get us. Leave their nest alone and they leave us alone. The wasps will completely die off when temperatures go below 32 degrees.

So what did our neighborhood ambassador decide? "I am just going to let them be and cohabitate. It's their world too, right?"

If there are teachers out there interested in having the nest for display, let us know. We found instructions for removing the nest--*in the winter--*for display. Read more here.

Edible Mushroom Inoculation Class & Demo

WHEN: Saturday, July 6 @ 10:00 AM to Noon

WHERE: Eggleston Park Food Forest, 2100 Hartrey Avenue, Evanston

Edible Evanston invites any prospective mushroom cultivators, or people simply curious about growing fungi, to this week's "workday". The regular Saturday volunteer time will be divided in half, with the second half devoted to mushroom inoculation. (Please plan to come to the entire workday to attend the class and demo.)

We will be making oyster mushroom pillars and winecap beds, but will discuss other aspects of mushroom cultivation. This class will cover the process of inoculating several types of mushrooms, such as shiitake on logs and oysters on stump pillars and stropharia rugosoannulata on wood chips. We'll teach principles of mushroom growing such as timing, wood selection, spawn types, etc.

Course taught by: Tim Sonder. Tim has been experimenting with cultivating mushrooms since 2017, and enjoys sharing his learning experience with others. He has picked and identified mushrooms in the wild since he could walk.

Attendance will be limited to 12 people. There will not be a take-home portion; we are working on refreshing our stock of mushroom growing infrastructure at the Food Forest. Please bring your own water and work gloves/boots. A hat is recommended. This course is free to attend as part of our "Work and Learn" volunteer experience.

Learn how the North Shore Mosquito Abatement District in Northfield, Illinois has been adapting to meet the present and future needs of our residents. Against this backdrop, the catalogue of materials capable of controlling mosquitoes is rapidly dwindling due to overuse, resistance, and regulatory pressure. The demand for ecological sustainability, the protection of endangered species,

and conservation adds another layer of complexity to the challenge of protecting the public health from a rising tide of threats.
